

The Writing Process

Steps	Assistive Technology	Learning Strategy
<p>Pre-writing Activity</p> <p>Students generate ideas and language—brainstorming</p>	<p>Smart Ideas/Inspiration</p>	<p>TOWER</p> <p>Start with a clear topic and enter it into middle bubble</p> <p>Brainstorm and list all the ideas as bubbles around your topic</p>
<p>Drafting</p> <p>Students express ideas in a tentative form as they try out ideas</p>	<p>Smart Ideas/Inspiration</p>	<p>TOWER</p> <p>Include introduction and conclusion bubbles</p> <p>Expand each idea</p> <p>Combine ideas that go together</p> <p>Switch to outline view and arrange points in order</p> <p>Start expanding ideas into sentences</p>
<p>Revising</p> <p>Students reshape, add, or delete ideas as they improve their writing</p>	<p>TextHelp Read & Write</p>	<p>TOWER & SCOPE</p> <p>Export your file into Word</p> <p>Continue to add information and reorganize your ideas</p> <p>Have TextHelp read your writing back to you to see if it makes sense</p>
<p>Editing</p> <p>Students check punctuation, word use, and spelling</p>	<p>TextHelp Read & Write</p>	<p>SCOPE</p> <p>Use the SCOPE checklist</p> <p>Check spelling, homonyms, capitalization, order of words, punctuation, complete thoughts</p>
<p>Publishing</p> <p>Students prepare their best copy of their completed writing and may add illustrations and a cover</p>	<p>Word—formatting, graphics, etc.</p>	<p>Select the size and type of font</p> <p>Indent paragraphs</p> <p>Add bibliography</p> <p>Add graphics and charts etc.</p>
