

Wordsearch Definitions and Explanations

IEP- Individual education planning is the process whereby teachers, support personnel, and parents work together as a team to meet the needs of individual students who require a range of supports.

IPRC- Identification, Placement and Review Committee made up of school and School Board personnel that makes decisions about the identification of your child as having special education needs or “an exceptionality”, the category of the exceptionality, and the appropriate classroom placement of your child.

Non-verbal- Individuals who often have trouble with some of the following: organization, attention, executive functioning, nonverbal communication (body language, facial expressions touch, space, voice), and motor skills.

Visual- a learning style where learning takes place by the student being able to see the information being presented to them, rather than listening to a lecture or watching demonstrations.

Tactile- a learning style where learning takes place by the students carrying out physical activities, rather than listening to a lecture or watching demonstrations.

Dyslexia- a learning disorder that involves difficulty reading due to problems identifying speech sounds and learning how they relate to letters and words (decoding). Dyslexia affects areas of the brain that process language.
